



# Prepare for a career in healthcare

Choose from a bachelor's completion degree in Health Sciences, a certificate in Health Care Informatics, or a microcredential in Interprofessional Leadership in Healthcare—or earn all three!

Rapid advancements in the quality and delivery of patient care, new technologies, and an aging population are several factors contributing to a strong and growing healthcare industry, and with it a variety of career opportunities. The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee offers three programs through the 100% online UW Flexible Option to help you take that next step in a healthcare career. You can earn each individually or add one—or both—to your bachelor's degree.



### Bachelor of Science in Health Sciences

If you want to work in healthcare, or move into another role within the healthcare industry, but need a bachelor's degree, the UW-Milwaukee Bachelor of Science in Biomedical Sciences: Health Sciences builds on your experience by developing and strengthening skills in critical thinking, problem solving, management, and interprofessional leadership. This curriculum prepares you to assume a wide range of roles within both clinical and non-clinical settings such as hospitals and other patient care facilities, government organizations, or insurance companies and allows you to earn additional credentials with your degree. With the UW Flexible Option, you can use your knowledge and experience to control the pace at which you earn your bachelor's degree.

Designed with flexibility, you can choose electives that prepare you for the healthcare career you want, and the degree curriculum builds on your associate degree, giving you 60 credits toward the 120-credit degree completion minimum.

You can earn the Health Care Informatics certificate along with your degree by choosing six elective courses (18 credits) in this program. As you complete required courses in the degree, you'll earn the Interprofessional Leadership in Healthcare microcredential and be awarded a digital badge you can use on your social media profiles or other places that immediately signifies to employers you've developed the skills to work effectively with and across patient care disciplines.

### **Health Care Informatics Certificate**

You can earn the UW-Milwaukee Health Care Informatics certificate, offered online through the UW Flexible Option, on its own by completing the six courses in the certificate. Or you can earn the certificate while you complete your Health Sciences bachelor's degree by selecting the courses that make up the certificate as electives. You'll gain the skills and knowledge to understand, analyze, and evaluate the information used by successful healthcare organizations to provide patient care. In addition, it can prepare you for a wide range of career options within hospitals, clinics, insurance, and pharmaceutical firms, as well as companies who design, develop, and implement health information systems. # **Healthcare Career Outlook**

According to the <u>US Bureau of Labor Statistics</u>, healthcare support occupations, healthcare practitioners, and technical occupations in the healthcare industry are expected to grow faster than average over the next 10 years, adding about 1.8 million jobs each year. This means credentialed health professionals will be especially well-positioned for career advancement.

### **Tuition**

This UW Flexible Option program offers busy adults an affordable way to earn a UW-Milwaukee certificate. Tuition is a flat rate of \$2,250 for the 12-week subscription period, which covers as many courses as you would like to take. If you want to take more time, this program has a one-course-at-a-time option, which is \$1,125 for a 12-week subscription period.

With the UW Flexible Option's subscription period model, you complete the program as fast or as slowly as you need. Competency-based learning means as soon as you master one domain, you move onto the next one. You won't spend valuable time repeating material you've previously mastered. If you already know it, you may be able to advance through the program more quickly.
